Sometimes as kids grow up going to Sunday School and hearing all the bible stories and lessons, they may not grasp the fact that bible "stories" are not just stories like "Frozen" or "Sleeping Beauty", and Todd had heard them so many times that maybe he hadn't put it all together yet or maybe I'd failed as a teacher to impart upon him that they were not just tales. So in the middle of my little class, as we all talked about some lesson taken from the bible, Todd – I guess he was about 11 or so -- suddenly looked up in shock and said, "You mean all this stuff REALLY HAPPENED? It's all real, not just stories?" Needless to say, his outburst was met with a little scorn and dismay from some of the other kids, but actually witnessing Todd's epiphany was one of the most memorable moments of my Sunday School teaching years. He was special. He will be missed but for this old retired Sunday School teacher, he will always be remembered. Please pray for his family to find comfort and understanding through our gracious Lord and Savior.


