The Key To Loving Others

February: Groundhog's Day. Valentine's Day. Presidents' Day. Black History Month. The Grammys. The Oscars. I'm sure I forgot something but there is a lot going on in February. For the moment, I'd like to write about the Oscars (but it's also related to Valentine's Day and Black History Month). My favorite movie that I have seen in the past year is "Fences." Not only is the acting sensational, but the story is raw and powerful and heartbreaking. I'm not going to play "spoiler" because if you haven't seen the movie yet, it is one that I highly recommend. I will simply say that I found the main character, Troy Maxson, played by Denzel Washington to be a tragic figure in that he could not give love to others because, for some reason, he was unable to receive love himself.

Last month I concluded our sermon series on "Living Faithfully in a World of Fear" by focusing on the famous text found in 1 John 4:10-12:

In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another.

Do you believe that God loves you? Do you really?

Do you believe that God loves you so much that He sent His son Jesus into this messy world? Do you believe that Jesus loves you so much that He laid down His life for **you** (and for every single person no matter who they are or where they are from?)

God loves **you**. Yes you! No matter who you are. No matter what you've done. No matter what! Joseph R Cooke said, "*Grace is the face that love wears when it meets imperfection.*" We are all far from perfect, nevertheless, we are all loved by God solely on account of God's grace.

My hope and prayer is that you know within your heart and your mind and your soul that you are deeply and unconditionally loved by God. For if we do not come to the understanding that we ourselves are loved, we cannot love those around us.

A WORKER APPROVED BY GOD Read 2 Timothy 2:14-19


Jesus is our anchor!
