### **INTERIM PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

<sup>23</sup>Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for God who has promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup> And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, <sup>25</sup> not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching. (Hebrews 10:23-25)

Have you ever wondered why people come to church? As much as I'd like to think it's about the sermon, or the worship service, for the most part that's not the case.

**So why do people come to church?** There may be many reasons, but I would say the number one reason is this: **community**, we need each other. In fact, I think that it is nearly impossible to live the Christian life without the support of brothers and sisters in Christ.

**WE ARE TO HOLD fast without wavering TO THE HOPE WE confess:** this is the basic goal of the Christian life. In the case of the Letter to the Hebrews, being a Christian meant risking persecution; it appears that these Jewish Christians were getting ready to give up and the writer issues this challenge: **hold on to the hope you profess without wavering.** 

Like the early Jewish Christians, there is a very real possibility that we could become discouraged and give up: that's where the other command comes in. "And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

THE WRITER SAYS: We need to MEET TOGETHER FOR ENCOURAGEMENT AND TO BE SPURRED ON, provoked, to love and do good deeds. The only way that we're going to be able to holdfast without wavering to the hope we profess is if we have the support of other Christians to help us – IF WE MEET TOGETHER. We need each other. God calls us into the community of God's children so we can have fellowship with and encourage one another.

In community, masks come off, conversations deepen, hearts open up, lives are shared, accountability is invited and compassion flows; people really do become like family. As we experience fellowship, community, we can become stronger and more vital, individually and as a community, as our lives become entwined with one another, moving closer together, deeply caring for each other. The very time we feel like isolating from people is the time we need to be with people the most.

I encourage you then to hold fast to your hope, without wavering. The best way you can do that is by drawing support from one another in the community of the faithful...by actively participating in the life of the church.
