# **INTERIM PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

The Advent Season – this time of waiting and preparation before Christmas - brings a heightened feeling that something new and life changing is coming. Like a faint sound in the distance drawing nearer. Like the waiting at the airport to be reunited with loved ones as they emerge from the terminal. Like the moment right before the sun peeks out from below the horizon. Like a promise about to come true. Something is coming that will remind us of the depth of God's love for us. Presbyterian Pastor and author Frederick Buechner writes:

"For a second you catch a whiff in the air of some fragrance that reminds you of a place you've never been and a time you have no words for. You are aware of the beating of your heart. The extraordinary thing that is about to happen is matched only by the extraordinary moment just before it happens. Advent is the name of that moment."

So I am writing to those who, like me, need to slow down and embrace the oft-missed words of the famous carol, "Let every heart prepare him room." How do we prepare: Join us for Sunday morning worship! Take time to read

Scripture, reflect and pray. Offer the gift of your time, your listening ear, your kind heart to a lonely neighbor.

Advent is a way of reminding us that we are pilgrims passing through; that the brokenness of this world isn't how it's always going to be; that something life-changing is indeed coming—we celebrate it in the birth of the babe of Bethlehem

December will be busy. But it doesn't have to be a blur. Let's begin preparing room in our hearts this Advent for Immanuel—God with us! See you Sunday!
